

**CAMP HILL BOROUGH COUNCIL
SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL
WORKSHOP MINUTES
PROSSER HALL
WEDNESDAY MAY 30, 2007**

The workshop began at 6:07 p.m. Present were:

Also present were Police Chief Ammons, Solicitor J. Stephen Feinour, Borough Manager Gary M. Kline and Borough Secretary Anne Shambaugh. Mr. McLemore arrived at 6:09 p.m.

Ms. Beckley requested approval for Starbuck's to hold a fundraiser in Willow Park on either August 4 or 12th to benefit the Mr. Holland's charitable organization, specifically the schools affected by Hurricane Katrina. Area bands and group would perform for approximately one hour each between 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. Ms. Beckley requested Starbuck's distribute flyers to all residents that live along the park so they are aware of the event.

- Motion made by Ms. Beckley, seconded by Mr. McLemore, to approve the request for Starbuck's to hold a fundraiser in Willow Park on either August 4th or August 12th with music beginning at 11:00 a.m. and ending at 8:00 p.m. Motion approved unanimously.

Mr. Whetstone of Starbuck's will coordinate the event with Mr. Kline and the police chief.

Mr. Kline requested approval for Mark Malarich to draft the Request for Proposal documents for the work to be done on the 24th and 27th Street underpasses.

- Motion made by Mr. McLemore, seconded by Mr. Buell, for Mark Malarich to draft the Request for Proposal documents for the work to be done on the 24th and 27th Street underpasses. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Kline announced the Cumberland County Redevelopment Authority began maintaining the property at 123 N 24th Street.

Mr. Kline presented two (2) options for the Safe Routes to School grant program. The first option recommended the grant paying 100% of the cost to repair and/or replace sidewalks and curbing along the School District's "primary walking routes." The second option recommended the grant pay 50% of the cost to repair and/or replace sidewalks and curbing along the School District's "primary walking routes" and some of the "secondary walking routes" and the homeowner paying 50% of the cost.

- Motion made by Mr. McLemore, seconded by Mr. Sledzinski, to approve option 2. After additional discussion regarding the option and comments from the public in attendance, the motion passed with a vote of 4-1.

There being no additional business to discuss, Mr. McBride requested a motion to adjourn.

- Motion made by Ms. Beckley, seconded by Mr. Weber to adjourn. Motion passed unanimously.
