§ 133-1. Restrictions on exterior lighting in residential districts. [Amended 12-9-1987 by Ord. No. 891, approved 12-9-1987]

Exterior lighting located on private property not in a public right-of-way in any areas zoned residential under the Camp Hill Zoning Ordinance¹ shall be governed by the following restriction: A single light or a combination of lights on a single standard or fixture shall not produce, at its source, lumens in excess of 10,000.

§ 133-2. Violations declared a nuisance.

Any person or persons who erect, cause to be erected or maintain exterior lighting in excess of the limits established herein shall be guilty of maintaining a nuisance and shall be subject to the penalties provided hereinafter.

§ 133-3. Violations and penalties.

Any person or persons in violation of the provisions of this chapter, upon conviction thereof before the District Justice, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$300, and costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, to suffer imprisonment in the Cumberland County Jail for not more than 30 days. A violation which continues after each conviction therefor shall be deemed a separate offense and shall be subject to the same fine and penalties.

§ 133-4. Additional remedies.

In addition to the other penalties provided herein, the Borough may file an action in equity to enjoin a continuing violation of the provisions of this chapter.
